ABOUT PLAYONSIDE PlayOnside is a non-govermental organisation founded in 2013, that uses football and playbased activities as tools to educate and empower Burmese migrants and refugee children, youth and adults displaced in Thailand. Since its inception, PlayOnside has grown to become a major player in spreading education by promoting Gender Equality, Social Inclusion and Empowerment among the Burmese community in Mae Sot, on the Thai-Burma border. Since the COVID pandemic, PlayOnside reinvented itself, creating new programs better suited to the needs of the community. The new projects have expanded to cover other areas besides sports such as Leadership, Sexual and Reproductive Health & Rights (SRHR), Emotional Resilience and a wide range of different activities related to life skills. Today, PlayOnside is still an integral part of the education system on the Thai-Burma border.

REGULAR FOOTBALL TRAINING SCHOOLS

Mae Sot's immigrant schools lack quality education due to their limited capacity and resources. Children do not have access to playful activities, which hinders their growth and development.

WEEKLY TRAININGS AT THE MIGRANT SCHOOLS





This program helps our players break down stigmas and social divisions, promoting greater inclusion in the Burmese community itself.







During the month of November and December, PlayOnside prepared a group of 15 players who would represent the Burmese community at the TAR Asia Qualifier in Bangkok. This tournament brings together the best teams in Asia to compete for a place in the TAR U11 **Promises** tournament Barcelona in (Spain). For the children who participated, it was the first time they had the opportunity to leave Mae Sot. It was a life-changing experience.



This experience provides a unique opportunity for our players to meet children of different nationalities, while encouraging them to open up and share their story with children who have had another type of childhood.



















This program was born in 2021 to provide basic needs such as food, medicine, masks to families that suffered the effects of the pandemic. As the pandemic situation dissipated, a new emergency emerged due to the coup in February 2021.

Since then, the aid was extended to those families forced to flee to Thailand due to the armed conflict Myanmar is facing.

During 2021 and 2022, PlayOnside supported the organization Teacher Focus on their research "Stepping Stones: The Impact of Twin Crises on the Future of Migrant Education in Thailand", It focused on understanding the impact of the twin crisis, the Myanmar conflict and the COVID pandemic, on children's access to education through interviewing students, parents, teachers, school directors and education organization representatives from across a spectrum of migrant education pathways in Tak province.

The research was initiated in May 2021 and concluded in August 2022.

PlayOnside assisted the project through the co-development of the research tools, supporting the research with their expertise on the field of migrants education in Mae Sot, and the analysis of the results of the research.

In December 2022, PlayOnside was invited to the celebration of the conclusion of the research.



This experience has given me priceless social and communication skills and the opportunity to travel and engage with individuals from diverse communities and backgrounds, enriching my perspective and knowledge.









At the end of June, PlayOnside, with the collaboration of FotMob, organized a tournament with the aim to foster an inclusion, equality and empowerment to the migrant community.

During the last week of October, PlayOnside collaborated with Daughters Rising to provide a two-day of Intensive Football Coaching Training at Maewang school, Chiang Mai. The aim of the coaching training was to empower young people to combat drug addictions within their communities.

In March 2022, PlayOnside continued colaborating with the organization Help Without Frontiers (HWF) to support the program Child Friendly Spaces.

The centers aim to accompany the socioemotional development of children by participating in weekly activities that promote their social skills, critical thinking, and emotional intelligence, among others.

In addition, PlayOnside developed a guideline to support the community champions of each of Child-Friendly Space when implementing the activities,


